## Scholarships available through Wheaton Dollars for Scholars

(Students must complete their Dollars for Scholars online profile to be eligible for these scholarships.)

- Alumni of 1983 Scholarship
  - \$250
  - Eligibility criteria: NA
  - Write a short essay on what song or band from the 1980's influenced you and why or how.
  
- Caring Above and Beyond Scholarship
  - \$500
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be planning to major in nursing, physical, occupational or speech therapy, dietitian, administration, or social work with the intent to work in the long-term care field.
  - Write a short essay on how you will use your education to help those in long-term care.
  
- Daryl Leininger Memorial Scholarship
  - \$500
  - Eligibility criteria: Must have a major limb amputation and plan to major in an agricultural related field.
  
- Edgar Olson Scholarship
  - \$200
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be planning a career in an educational field. Applicants who have a long record of participation in Boy Scouts will also be given consideration in selection.
  - Write a short essay explaining why you have decided to pursue a career in the education profession and also answer the question; Did you participate in the Boy Scout program?

- Eligibility criteria: Must be planning to major in Mathematics, Physics, or Education, have an agricultural background, be female, be a first-generation college student, and plan to attend Minnesota State University Moorhead.
- Write a short essay describing your current career plan and what you believe your life plan will be 5 years after earning your degree.

  - \$500
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be planning a career in the medical or human services field.
  
- Mary Ann Ekberg Teigan Memorial Elementary Education Scholarship
  - \$500
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be planning to major in Elementary Education.
  
- Melanie Peterson Scholarship
  - \$300
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be planning a career in a human services field. Preference will be given to applicants who show a record of participation in FCCLA leadership activities.
  - Write a short essay explaining how you have demonstrated empathy, dedication and trustworthiness during your high school career at Wheaton Area Schools.

  - Eligibility criteria: NA
  - Write an essay that answers the following question: How has the education you received at Wheaton Area Schools prepared you for your future?
  
- Wheaton Fire Department Relief Association Scholarship
  - \$200
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a student who has a parent who has served or is serving on the Wheaton Fire Department.

  - Eligibility criteria: Must be pursuing a career in an agricultural field or an agriculture-supporting profession.

  - \$500
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a dependent of a current Traverse Electric member.
  - Write a short essay that describes how a cooperative can build a culture to best serve its members.
  
- Traverse County Corn Growers Association Scholarship
  - \$1500
  - Eligibility criteria: All students are encouraged to apply but primary scholarship will be awarded to applicants pursuing a career in the agricultural field.
  
- Traverse County Soil and Water Conservation District Scholarship
  - \$400
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be interested in pursuing a degree within a conservation or agricultural related field.
  
- Tri-County Cooperative Oil Association Scholarship
  - \$250
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be interested in pursuing a degree in an agricultural related field.

- Clean Air Choice Biodiesel Scholarship
  - \$1,000
  - \$500
  - Eligibility criteria: NA
  - Submit a 1,000-word essay on the specified biodiesel topic OR submit a video essay response ranging in length from 30 seconds to 3 minutes.
  
- Ada and Helmuth 4-H Scholarship
  - \$1,000
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a MN 4-H member
  
- CCI Innovation in Agriculture 4-H Scholarship
  - \$1,000
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a MN 4-H member and planning to pursue a degree in agriculture. Preference is given to students pursuing a degree in agronomy, soil science, horticulture, plant science, ag economics, agribusiness or closely related field.
  
- David and Valerie Pace 4-H Scholarship
  - \$1,000
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be or have been involved in 4-H
  
- Kern 4-H Scholarship
  - \$1,500
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a 4-H member, planning to attend school in the University of Minnesota State Colleges and Universities System or University of MN campus, have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better.
  
- Ducks Unlimited National Scholarship
  - 50 Varsity Scholarships at \$500 each
  - 10 Conservation Scholarships at \$1,000 each

- 1 National Scholarship of \$10,000
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a current Ducks Unlimited member and have a minimum GPA of 3.0.
  - Write a short essay that answers the following question, “How have your outdoor experiences contributed to your understanding of the importance of wetlands, and what are the ways in which you have acted and/or intend to act on this knowledge?”
- Minnesota Telecom Alliance Foundation Scholarship
    - \$2,000
    - Eligibility criteria: NA
    - Write a short essay that answers the following questions: What is your primary goal in life? Why did you choose that goal? How do you expect to achieve that goal?
- Mediacom Communications World Class Scholarship
    - \$1,000
    - Eligibility: Applicant must live in an area serviced by Mediacom.
- Alpha Kappa Psi Scholarship
    - \$5,000-\$20,000
    - Eligibility criteria: Must be an incoming freshman admitted to the Carlson School of Management at the University of Minnesota.
- American Legion Auxiliary Children of Warriors National Presidents’ Scholarship
    - \$5,000
    - Eligibility criteria: Must complete 50 hours of volunteer service and candidates shall be daughters, sons, grandsons, granddaughters, great-granddaughters, or great-grandsons of veterans who served in the armed forces during eligibility dates for membership in The American Legion:
      - a. April 6, 1917 through November 11, 1918 (WWI)
      - b. December 7, 1941 through December 31, 1946 (WWII)
      - c. June 25, 1950 through January 31, 1955 (Korea)
      - d. February 28, 1961 through May 7, 1975 (Vietnam)

- e. August 24, 1982 through July 31, 1984 (Grenada and Lebanon)
  - f. December 20, 1989 through January 31, 1990 (Panama)
  - g. August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities (Persian Gulf to present)
- Write an essay that answers the following question: “How can education, both private and public, help prevent homelessness in our country, particularly that of our veteran population?”
- American Legion Auxiliary Department of MN Scholarship
  - \$1,000
  - Eligibility criteria: Must be a son, daughter, grandson, or granddaughter of a veteran who served in the Armed Forces during one of these eligibility dates:
    - a. April 6, 1917 through November 11, 1918 (WWI)
    - b. December 7, 1941 through December 31, 1946 (WWII)
    - c. June 25, 1950 through January 31, 1955 (Korea)
    - d. February 28, 1961 through May 7, 1975 (Vietnam)
    - e. August 24, 1982 through July 31, 1984 (Grenada and Lebanon)
    - f. December 20, 1989 through January 31, 1990 (Panama)
    - g. August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities (Persian Gulf to present)
  - Write an essay that addresses plans for higher education, career goals, extracurricular and community activities and the need for financial assistance.
