

Although voters approved a new \$200K operating levy request in **2021**, these additional dollars do not cover the gap between state funding and inflation.

What has the District been doing?

For Fiscal Year 2025, the district has reduced their operational expenditure budget by over 5%.

Without these two referendum questions, the next round of expenditure reductions for Fiscal Year 2026 will dramatically re-shape Wheaton's educational program offerings and services.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BALLOT QUESTION 1 APPROVAL OF SCHOOL DISTRICT REFERENDUM REVENUE AUTHORIZATION

The School Board of Independent School District No. 803 (Wheaton Area Schools), Minnesota has proposed to increase its general education revenue by \$830.06 per pupil, subject to an annual increase at the rate of inflation. The proposed referendum revenue authorization would be first levied in 2024 for taxes payable in 2025 and would be applicable for ten (10) years unless otherwise revoked or reduced by law.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BALLOT QUESTION 2 APPROVAL OF SCHOOL DISTRICT CAPITAL PROJECT LEVY AND BOND

The School Board of Independent School District No. 803 (Wheaton Area Schools), Minnesota has proposed a capital project levy authorization of 1.673% times the net tax capacity of the school district. The proposed capital project levy authorization will raise approximately \$175,000 for taxes payable 2025, the first year it is to be levied, and would be authorized for 10 years. The estimated total cost of the projects to be funded over that time period is approximately \$1,750,000. The proposed capital project levy will provide funds for technology curriculum, software, contracted IT services, textbooks, and supplies. The projects to be funded have received a positive review and comment from the Commissioner of Education. In addition, the school board of Independent School District No. 803 (Wheaton Area Schools) has proposed to issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$1,740,000. The proposed bonds will provide funds for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including but not limited to the acquisition, installation, replacement and maintenance of technology hardware & software, computers, mobile devices, networks, infrastructure, vehicles, machinery, and equipment.

NOTE:

Seasonal rec property and agricultural land beyond dwelling value (home, garage and one acre) are exempt from Question #1.

The Capital Projects Levy Portion of Question #2 is not eligible for the Ag2School Tax Credit.

Qualifying Agricultural Properties are eligible for the Ag2School Credit for the bond portion.

Tax Relief Measures

 There are available tax relief measures that can reduce the impact of the two questions for Minnesota residents.

Regular Residential Property Tax Refund

- Annual Refund for Eligible Households
- A Homeowner with a household income of up to \$135,410 is eligible for a property tax refund of up to \$3,310. A renter with a household income of up to \$73,270 is eligible for a property tax refund of up to \$2,570.

Special Residential Property Tax Refund

• If you are a homeowner, you may be eligible for a special property tax refund. This refund has no income limit, and the maximum refund is \$1,000. You may qualify if your net property tax increased by more than 12% between 2024 to 2025, and the increase is at least \$100.
